STIPULATION AND ORDER

Case No. DOPL 2011- 102

The Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing through Karl G. Perry Assistant Attorney General ("Division") and Nicola I. Riley, M.D. ("Respondent") stipulate and agree as follows:

- Respondent admits the jurisdiction of the Division over Respondent and over subject matter of this action.
- 2. Respondent acknowledges that she enters into this Stipulation and Order knowingly and voluntarily.

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- 3. Respondent understands that she has the right to be represented by counsel in this matter, and she has been represented by Eric Strindberg in this matter.
- 4. Respondent acknowledges that this Stipulation and Order, if adopted by the Division, will be classified as a public document.
- 5. Respondent acknowledges that on August 31, 2010, the Maryland State Board of Physicians suspended the license of Nicola I. Riley, M.D. to practice medicine in the State of Maryland, and that this August 31, 2010 Order issued by the Maryland State Board of Physicians, is an interim, and not a final, order.
- 6. Respondent agrees that her license to practice medicine will be restricted so that she shall not perform any abortion procedures on patients within the State of Utah after February 1, 2011, until a final order regarding Respondent's Maryland license is issued from the State of Maryland.
- 7. The parties agree that the Division shall not take any reciprocal disciplinary action on Respondent's license to practice medicine in Utah based upon the Maryland order until a final order is issued by Maryland. At such time as a final order is issued by the Maryland State Board of Physicians, the Division may review the final order to determine if reciprocal action should be taken by the Division. The Division will not take Reciprocal action on the Maryland order without providing the Respondent notice and an opportunity to be heard.

- 8. The Division may investigate any complaints and take appropriate disciplinary action based upon unprofessional or unlawful conduct based upon Respondent's Utah practice of medicine.
- 9. The parties agree that except for the Respondent's restriction on performing abortions in the State of Utah, her Utah license to practice medicine remains current, without discipline, and she may continue to practice medicine in the State of Utah without any other restrictions.
- 10. The Respondent has read each and every paragraph contained in this Stipulation and Order and represents that she understands each and every paragraph contained in this Stipulation and Order.
